Fireworks Safety Tips

Each July 4th, thousands of people, mostly children and teens, are injured while using fireworks. The safetest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals. If you are using consumer fireworks, remember:

- Only use fireworks outdoors.
- Obey your local laws. If fireworks are not legal where you live, do not use them.
- Always have water handy, whether a hose or a bucket filled with water.
- Only use fireworks as they were intended. Do not try to alter them or combine them.
- Never relight a "dud" firework. You should wait 20 minutes, place the "dud" in a bucket of water and then discard them.
- Use common sense. Spectators should keep a safe distance from the shooter and the shooter should always wear safety glasses.
- Remember that alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Have a "designated shooter."
- Only people over the age of 12 should be allowed to handle sparklers of any type. Sparklers burn at 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.
- Never allow children to pick up fireworks that are left over, as they may still be active.
- Do not use homemade fireworks, illegal fireworks or explosives. They can kill you.
- Report illegal explosives and fireworks to the fire or police department in your community.
